## Bicycle tours another way to see Kent

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KENT — Warm weather draws scores of cyclists to the roads of the Northwest Corner and it's not unusual to see them riding in packs.

On Thursday, July 21, one of those packs consisted of 39 girls from Camp Ramah in the Berkshires in Wingdale, N.Y. The campers came to Kent for a 10-mile bike ride before cooling off withice cream at Backcountry Outfitters.

Harmonie Rosenberg, one of the girls' counselors, described the trip as a "special treat." The campers typically engage in swimming, arts and crafts and outdoor adventure.

The ride was organized by Sal Lilienthal, director of the Bicycle Tour Company in Kent, which offers rentals and repairs but states its main goal is to promote cycling through group outings and the mapping of routes.

Lilienthal and Dan Bolognani, executive director of the Upper Housatonic Valley National Heritage Area, are currently working on an application for a grant from the National Parks Service to create the Western New England Greenway, a bike route that will begin in New York City and end in Montreal.

"Bicylingkeepspeoplehealthy, it's good for the environment and it's good for economic development," Lilienthal said.
